Dear Friends

some of our accomplishments this year

In 2016, Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) took notice of GBLT's important conservation efforts, and we joined a small handful of other Canadian land conservancies recognized by the ECCC this year for significant contributions towards the preservation of Canada's biodiversity through Ecological Gifts. The honour arose out of our work in establishing the 51 acre Kofman Moose Bay nature refuge. The refuge is an ecological jewel providing habitat for ten species at risk, five being identified during the first site inventory alone.

Grants from the Ontario Trillium Foundation and Environment and Climate Change Canada accelerated the securement of ecologically important lands. The notable increase in 2016 in the number of wilderness properties coming under protection is very gratifying and we fully expect that upward trend to continue. Grants to enhance communication outreach are building awareness of the importance of land conservation within our biosphere.

To grow an organization requires talented, hard-working and passionate directors, staff, advisors and volunteers. We wish to thank our staff: Brooks Greer, Sarah Koetsier, Irina Denissova and Jason Wagar. All of these fine individuals' efforts made 2016 a very successful year. Brooks has made our Conservation Quest Program blossom from a seedling in 2013 to a program providing over 500 children with in-the-field conservation learning. He has initiated and guided important Species at Risk (SAR) inventorying and electronic monitoring of SAR on GBLT properties. Sarah Koetsier with important guidance from Committee Chair Jen Kernaghan developed all of GBLT's numerous new communications pieces, distributed these materials far and wide, all while organizing a record number of summer events and with Jen, did a brilliant job organizing our fall Bayscapes fundraiser. Our many thanks to our summer students Tilly Cook and Anne Hughes who did a wonderful job stewarding and delivering an inspiring Conservation Quest Program. In closing, our greatest thanks to our very strong, multi-talented and capable Board of Directors who in 2016 brought their experience, professional ability, wisdom and direction to bear on new initiatives: accelerated land protection, differentiating our communications messaging, expanding our stewardship efforts (SAR monitoring), expanding the number of Land Protection Committees to 18 from 1 active one, and ensuring very positive growth in our stewardship and education endowed funds. To our Secretary, Treasurer and all Committee Chairs, thank you so much for a job well done! We also wish to thank those advisors who stepped up to provide their wisdom. Working alongside communities to monitor and maintain wilderness lands forever.


PLAN

Our land protection activities are grounded in a scientific plan for the conservation of priority habitat in the eastern Georgian Bay watershed.

Through our Natural Area Conservation Plan, developed in conjunction with the Nature Conservancy of Canada, we prioritize land for conservation based on a series of targets including biodiversity, habitat connectivity, and at-risk species.

In 2016, we began making plans to update the Natural Area Conservation Plan (NACP), which was last completed in 2011. The new NACP will include the latest information on habitat changes and species sightings, and will incorporate planning for climate change resiliency and corridors for species movement. Stay tuned for more developments!

2016 also marked the beginning of a targeted outreach program to owners of the most ecologically significant land in southeastern. Georgian Bay. With support from the Ontario Trillium Foundation, the GBLT created a suite of communications materials designed to inform these landowners of the significance of their land and the conservation opportunities that are available to them. This is an important step forward for the GBLT as we work to ensure that critical habitat is protected throughout eastern Georgian Bay.

New Properties

We welcomed three new protected properties and finalized the transfer of four others in 2016.

The following properties, either partially or entirely donated by American citizens, were until this year protected by American Friends of Canadian Land Trusts and stewarded by the Georgian Bay Land Trust.

PROPERTIES

Crane Lake Reserve 1 acre Crane Lake

The Crane Lake Reserve serves as an important habitat connection between a significant interior wetland and the shoreline of Crane Lake. One of the Land Trust's few inland properties, it boasts more extensive soil development than is common on coastal Georgian Bay, and includes Sugar Maple and Eastern Hemlock forests, as well as a small representation of Eastern White Cedar and Red Oak.

Steamboat Channel Reserve 35 acres Pointe au Baril

Protecting some of the last remaining old growth white pine forest on Georgian Bay, the Steamboat Channel Reserve is a significant conservation success for the Pointe au Baril community. The property is a documented home to several species at risk, including the Eastern Foxsnake and Whip-poor-will, and its natural shoreline has long been a treasured kayaking and canoeing destination for local residents. This property will remain in its natural state thanks to the generosity and tireless efforts of community members over many years of negotiations – congratulations and thank you to all involved!

Kofman Moose Bay Reserve 51 acres Wah Wah Taysee

The Kofman Moose Bay Reserve protects 51 acres of extremely high quality coastal and rock barren habitat just south of O'Donnell Point in the Wah Wah Taysee community. This is ideal habitat for many of Georgian Bay's species, including the five at-risk reptiles positively identified there: Northern Map Turtle, Snapping Turtle, Eastern Milksnake, Eastern Ribbonsnake, and Massasauga Rattlesnake. Due to its wonderful diversity, the Kofman Reserve was selected by the federal Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change as one of four signature protected properties to be showcased and celebrated in 2016.

STEWARD

The GBLT remains committed to looking after our properties fastidiously. We strive to set the highest standard for property care and conservation. We do this with the help of our 115 volunteer stewards who look after each of the GBLT-owned properties. That we have so many dedicated volunteers is a testament to the importance Georgian Bayers attach to our work.

We have two well attended educational meetings for the stewards each year. This year Gregor Beck of Bird Studies Canada spoke to us about "Wildlife Barometers", and gave instruction on differentiating between similar-looking Georgian Bay reptiles. At the fall meeting Karl Schiefer spoke about "Georgian Bay: The Unique Ecosystem."

Our staff Brooks Greer and Bill Lougheed make sure every property is covered, and provide for ongoing inventories. The summer students are important in caring for our more visited southern properties; the Pointe au Baril Marine Patrol perform the same stewarding duties on our 14 properties local to them. We have important community partners who we help and support to advance conservation and research activities. These include White Squall, the Ontario Land Trust Alliance (OLTA) and the Georgian Bay Biosphere Reserve (GBBR).



LEARN

At the Georgian Bay Land Trust, we're always interested in learning more about the species on our properties and contributing to conservation-oriented scientific research. Below are a few of the projects we were a part of in 2016.

1. Ontario Land Trust Alliance (OLTA) - Species at Risk monitoring

OLTA scientists Alison Howson and Toby Thorne visited three GBLT properties multiple times over the summer to collect data on at risk species. Together with GBLT staff, they installed bat recorders which successfully identified little brown bats, and identified several at-risk reptiles living on our properties. These findings not only allow us to better protect these species on our properties, but also contribute to a provincial database that informs conservation efforts throughout the province.

2. Georgian Bay Biosphere Reserve (GBBR) - Massasauga gestation site study

Glenda Clayton of the GBBR led surveys on three GBLT properties to identify Massasauga Rattlesnake gestation sites, in year one of an ongoing monitoring project. Results from this study will lead to a better understanding of reproduction and gestation trends among Massasaugas, and help to indentify habitat changes that may be impacting this at-risk species' ability to reproduce.

3. John Urquhart - Snake Fungal Disease study

Herpetologist John Urquhart visited both Sandy Island and Giant's Tomb, and collected data to contribute to his study of Snake Fungal Disease among Massasauga Rattlesnakes and Eastern Foxsnakes. This life-threatening fungus has recently been identified among Ontario's snakes, and John and others are working to identify the distribution and origin of the fungus.

4. Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) - Bird call sampling

Mary Garvey and her colleagues from the MNRF installed a recording device in the Port Severn Wetlands property intended specifically to identify any occurrences of King Rails (endangered) or Least Bitterns (threatened). Data from this study will help estimate population size and distribution of these two species throughout Ontario, identify critical habitat for the birds, and contribute to the province's conservation strategy.



INSPIRE

Getting people excited about conservation and engaging responsibly with their local environment is a core part of the GBLT's mission. We ran 16 public events in 2016 which brought communities together to learn about, care for, and explore their environment. The kids' Conservation Quest program continued to be a hit, reaching more children than ever. We also focused on sharing educational material through our communications channels, including the LandScript newsletter (redesigned this year) and social media, whose reach increased by 36% in 2016. It is so rewarding to see people of all ages getting to know the natural world around them. The engagement we're seeing bodes well for the future of conservation.

Conservation Quest

Kids ages 8-11 continue to enjoy the Conservation Quest program, where they discover how to identify Georgian Bay's bird calls and fish species, learn how to be an environmentally-responsible resident and visitor, and even have a chance to get up close and personal with some of our local reptiles. In 2016 support from the TD Friends of the Environment Foundation allowed us to expand Conservation Quest to reach nearly 500 kids in camps and communities around the Bay.

FINANCIALS

Investment Committee

The Georgian Bay Land Trust is pleased to report a very positive return on our trust investment for the year 2016. Our funds grew from an opening balance of \$1,580,541 to \$1,766,014 representing a year over year investment return of 11.73% after all fees and expenses.

The GBLT's ongoing target and Canadian Revenue Agency (CRA) obligations lead us to distribute 4% of our funds to general purposes. The intention is to meet goals and to achieve long term stable asset growth matching the profile and needs of the GBLT mandate. The fund is invested in a broad grouping of conservative and established Canadian equities plus 10% of preferred shares and 30% US stocks.

The overall balance of this Fund has proudly grown from \$1,040,473, January 1st, 2012 to \$1,766,014, as of December 31st, 2016 after all investment returns, donations and withdrawals. This represents an annual compounding growth of 11.16%. I would like to thank my committee members: Sandy Boyd, John Catto and David Doritty, who have been very helpful in guiding the GBLT Investment Committee.

Momentum continues to build with individual donations up 10% over 2015. In a year where the organization was without a Director of Development for the second half of the year, hats go off for all the hard work by many, especially the wonderful leadership provided by Bill Lougheed and his team.

Notable fundraising events that continue to help us connect with the Georgian Bay community were the following: Rock the Bay (held annually in August), the Scotiabank Charity Challenge at the Toronto Waterfront Marathon, and of course November's Bayscapes Bash + Auction. These events, as well as many of our other activities, would not be possible without the generosity of the following Corporate sponsors: Georgian International, Topper Linen, C.C. Finance Committee

2016 was a very successful year for the GBLT, financially speaking. Our net assets increased by a very impressive almost \$4.5 million. We acquired more than \$4 million of new property, which represents a 15% increase over last year. Our long-term funds are up by almost \$184,000 in donations alone, or 12%, and our current net assets are \$230,000 higher than last year. The GBLT is stronger than ever.

This strength will allow the GBLT to do even more for our part of Georgian Bay. The organization is very clearly reaching a significantly higher plateau than that of only a few years ago. Staff, directors, supporters, volunteers, and especially donors should be congratulated and thanked for all that has been achieved. Thank you very much!




Donations Received for Immediate Land Aquisition




