

25 YEARS OF PROTECTING WILDERNESS EXPANSES

After 25 years of amazing growth, your land trust continues to be the major organization protecting wilderness expanses on the eastern shore of Georgian Bay. The Nature Conservancy of Canada has been of enormous help over our first 25 years in helping get the job done. Thank you NCC.

While other issues important to Georgian Bay cannot and should not be ignored, conservation of our wilderness places in perpetuity provides a lasting and unchanging legacy. It is forever.

In 2015 we:

- Brought 4 new properties into perpetual protection including Price Island in Pointe au Baril, Thomson Expansion lands in Nares Inlet, Jean G. Northey Conservation Reserve in Cognashene and Loudon Island in Pointe au Baril.
- Submitted grants to expand and accelerate the protection of Georgian Bay wilderness. Two of these applications were successful; announcements about these exciting developments will come in 2016.
- Expanded our youth education program that engages children in the love of nature and its appreciation to include over 400 children aged 8-12. Further growth into more communities is in the works for 2016.
- Received a grant to extend our inventorying and tracking of species at risk on GBLT properties. Stay tuned for an announcement in 2016.
- Moved ahead with initiating a program to use the full range of GBLT properties as a vehicle for monitoring
 important species and their movements. This is hopefully the start of using the full expanse our terrestrial
 conservation inventory as a sentinel for the health of terrestrial systems on Georgian Bay. We will have more to
 report on that initiative in late 2016 or early 2017.

As we look forward to the summer of 2016, our enthusiasm for the next 25 years continues unabated. We have over 15 land conservation projects on the go, a growing education program, exciting 25 year celebration events in several communities and the launch of a wilderness conservation outreach program.

I look forward to our exciting work in 2016 made possible by our donors, our supporters, and our volunteers with the help of our able staff led by our very special, dedicated and tireless Executive Director Bill Lougheed. It is every one of you that makes the Land Trust the voice of terrestrial conservation on Georgian Bay.

LAND PROTECTION

New Properties

We welcomed three new protected properties and expanded an existing property in 2015.

Jean G. Northey Conservation Reserve • 12.5 acres • Cognashene

Located in Longuissa Bay, the Northey Reserve preserves some of the highest quality wetlands in the Great Lakes. Generously donated by Pat Northey, this property provides critical spawning and nursery habitat for largemouth bass and yellow perch, and contains a rare vegetation community type for Georgian Bay, mixed Hemlock - Sugar Maple forest.

Price Island • 3.3 acres • Pointe au Baril

This pretty and remarkably flat island consists mostly of shrubbed rock barren. It provides important habitat for Eastern foxsnake and Massasauga rattlesnake - both species at risk. Price Island was donated by both Canadian and American citizens and represents the first cross-border Ecological Gift donation ever initiated.

Loudon Island • 3.2 acres • Pointe au Baril

Loudon Island is a refuge for animals and vegetation within the dense cottage area of central Pointe au Baril. In addition to forest and rock barrens, Loudon contains several areas of meadow marsh along the shoreline and a floating-leaved shallow aquatic wetland. These provide ideal habitat for local reptile species at risk, including Eastern foxsnake, Five-lined skink, Snapping turtle, and Massasauga rattlesnake. There has also been an active merlin nest spotted on the property.



Thomson Reserve Expansion • 5.3 acres • Nares Inlet

The Thomson Reserve began with the donation of a ¾ acre island in 1991, and it has since been expanded several times to its current total of 17 acres. This final expansion consists of the property's cottage islands, which were bequeathed to us by the late Robert Thomson. We plan to restore these islands to their natural state, so they can join the rest of the property as part of an extensive and remarkably undisturbed natural area.

Robert Thomson

Robert Thomson was a longstanding supporter of the Georgian Bay Land Trust since donating one of our first properties in 1991. Robert grew up spending summers in Nares with his brothers Tom and John and his mother Anne. As adults, the Thomson brothers were fixtures of the Nares community, and their property became something of a local meeting place - a quality it retains to this day. Whether it was community tennis games, church services on the porch, or brushing up on nature and wilderness skills, Nares cottagers have many fond memories of the Thomson brothers and the Thomson Reserve. We are so fortunate to protect this property so that it can remain a treasured natural area forever, and we thank Robert for his generosity to the Land Trust and the community for many years.

The Georgian Bay Land Trust's Land Protection Committee has experienced a meaningful level of activity and growth in 2015. This momentum has been fueled in part by a heightened awareness of the Land Trust generally through strategic marketing initiatives and targeted events. We believe that as we build on this impetus it will facilitate growth in a consequential and positive way.

The Land Protection Committee members are extremely fortunate to have a strong internal support. Everyone is tireless in working leads of potential land and easement donors. It all succeeds through a disciplined approach beginning with mapping and data system review to assess environmental criteria followed by carefully executed processes and procedures. This attention to detail ensures a reliable and professional framework for years to come. Thanks to all donors for your amazing generosity in preserving the beauty of Georgian Bay.




Removing Phragmites at Sandy/Ingersoll

In August, the Land Trust hosted a volunteer workshop to remove the invasive Phragmites australis from our Sandy and Ingersoll Islands, led by Kristyn Ferguson and Laura Robson of the Nature Conservancy of Canada. Kristyn and Sandy/Ingersoll Lead Steward Brian Rohde had visited the afflicted shore the previous summer to locate and assess the Phrag patches.

Thankfully, the great majority of the substantial Phrag stands were in fact of the native, non-invasive species. Nevertheless the crew of about 25 set to work, learning first how to identify and pull invasive Phrag and ultimately removing fifteen garbage bags of the invasive variety from five different patches. Since it is notoriously tenacious, we'll need to repeat this effort next year and possibly in further years after that.

Conservation Quest

Our kids' Conservation Quest program continued to grow in 2015, reaching over 400 children at summer camps and in cottage communities throughout the eastern shore of Georgian Bay. 

2015 FINANCIALS

Investment Committee

I would like to thank my committee members: Sandy Boyd, John Catto, Fred Dalley, and David Doritty. The Georgian Bay Land Trust is pleased to report a positive year in our funds held for investment purposes while markets paused. The fund grew from an opening balance of \$1,554,486 by \$74,615.33 representing a year over year investment return of 4.8% leading to a gross year end balance of \$1,580,154 after distributions of \$59,042.

The GBLT's ongoing target and Canadian Revenue Agency (CRA) obligations leads us to distribute 4% of our funds to general purposes. The intention is to meet goals and to achieve long term stable asset growth matching the profile and needs of the GBLT mandate. The fund is invested in a broad grouping of conservative and established Canadian equities plus 14% of preferred shares and 33% US stocks.

Fundraising Committee

In a year of highlights, it's difficult to focus on just a few. Your Land Trust achieved much in the area of Fundraising this year. A full roster of summer events included the first-ever Rock the Bay concert in Cognashene, hosted by Steve Geraedts & Martha Davidson as a fundraiser in support of the Land Trust. The Bayscapes Bash + Auction was back with an incredible selection of art and silent auction items and The Big Sound had us dancing well into the evening. A thoughtful anonymous donor matched all contributions to our year-end giving campaign, which as a result, was up over 20% from the year prior. We were also fortunate to have a number of community members step forward to make generous financial gifts in the area of land protection this year. Thank you to all of the Land Trust's donors for believing in our vision—your support makes all the great work profiled in this report possible.

Finance Committee

The GBLT continued to strengthen its financial position in 2015. While the top priority must be the wonderful properties on Georgian Bay, a good financial position is required to continue all the necessary work to protect and steward the land, for education, and to manage operations.

During 2015 the value of protected property grew by \$2,397,760, or 10%. The long-term invested funds and operating funds grew by a total of \$98,179, or about 5%, after all expenses. This is due to the great generosity of GBLT donors as well as the sound fiscal management of staff.






