

In 2014, we undertook GIS work in order to statistically analyse and sort land data and to use these analytics to build tables, charts and maps that better inform and prioritise conservation efforts beyond what our Natural Area Conservation Plan can provide. This will allow strategic focusing of the organization and its Land Protection Committees, and allow local community audiences to easily grasp the ecological importance of their region and the importance of local conservation. This GBLT program will begin its roll-out in 2015 through a partnership agreement with the Nature Conservancy of Canada (NCC). I wish to thank Mary Grunstra from U of T for providing invaluable assistance to me with this project, and my gratitude goes also to the GIS staff at both the Archipelago and Township of Georgian Bay.

Easements are an important tool in conservation. In 2014, I undertook an initiative to place conservation easements on a more sure footing. These efforts bore fruit and brought into force a new "Conservation Easements" zone and zoning-by law for the Township of Georgian Bay. 2015 will see an effort to repeat this success in the Township of the Archipelago. Such by-laws bring enforcement teeth to conservation easements.

To grow an organization requires talented, hard-working and passionate directors, staff, advisors and volunteers. I wish to thank my staff: Brooks Greer, Janet Lougheed, Sarah Koetsier, Kristin Koetsier and Laura Gibson, and summer students Lindsay Potts and Thomas Tawaststjerna. All of these fine individuals' efforts made 2014 a very successful year. Brooks grew our Conservation Quest Program from a seedling in 2013 to a program that brought in-the-field conservation learning to over 250 children. Well done! Kristin Koetsier disseminated our communications materials far and wide, organized summer events and did a brilliant job, learning the requirements of the job on the fly. Good job! Janet did an exceptional job in traversing the Bay in her unsinkable way, promoting the GBLT despite marrying off both sons during the summer. Admirable job! #### In 2014 we:

- · Created new marketing materials to create greater awareness of the GBLT within our communities.
- Launched a brand new and wonderful website which allows our stewards to report directly from the field a key and important development in terms of the importance of the stewarding we do.
- Launched a new field research station at Brebeuf Lighthouse at which one of our Board Directors,
   Dr. Nick Eyles, had a team of students perform research last fall. We intend to continue growing our collaboration with professors and students leveraging the power of the lands and locations we have. This will further research that aids in the conservation efforts to which our community is so committed.
- Hosted many outreach events up and down the Bay and in the city as well, to engage our community and newcomers to the GBLT. Many of these events provide not just a social component where loyal supporters can get to know each other and catch up but also add learning components to the materials and events themselves.
- Had over 100 stewards actively monitoring our properties to ensure that they are properly managed and continue to remain in a healthy and natural state.
- Raised sufficient funds to meet our operating and financial commitments.
- Brought into our care the Longuissa Bay property and continue to actively monitor other properties we hope to be able to take under our wing in the relatively near future.

The end of the year saw us facing a big change and an opportunity to continue to grow as an organization as our long standing Director of Development, Janet Lougheed, decided to retire after 9 years of wonderful service to our organization. I am happy to report that we welcomed Jason Wagar as our new Director of Development on May 4, 2015. Jason comes to us with an impressive background of successful fundraising positions at other organizations. He has a robust and relevant educational background and has his CFRE designation as well. The recruiting team who were charged with finding our new candidate followed a rigorous process and all are delighted with the addition of Jason to the team.

As we look forward to the summer of 2015, the water levels are higher, the enthusiasm of our community continues to grow and we are excited to tackle the list of projects and ongoing conservation work ahead of us. I look forward to continuing this work with the help of our staff, our volunteers, donors and supporters. Without all of you, none of this is possible. With you, no matter how hard the wind blows from the west, no matter how tall the waves roll in, we are like the granite underneath us, strong and forever.

In 2014 the GBLT received a generous bequest from the estate of Robert Thomson representing the balance of the Thomson family's magnificent holdings on Nares Point. The "Thomson Expansion" consists of two islands of four and one acres respectively where the family dwellings stand. This latest Thomson donation presents us with some interesting possibilities (and some liabilities) because of the buildings.

Although no other properties closed during calendar 2014, it was a busy year nevertheless. The 12.5 acre Northey-Longuissa property was pending for most of the year - and then closed in the first week of 2015. Preparations were made during 2014 for the donation of several properties, and we anticipate a flurry of acquisition activity in early 2015. At time of writing there are four further properties "in the pipe" that we anticipate will close in 2015. One of these is a fractional cross-border ownership situation similar to Rattlesnake Island, which we acquired in 2013.

Our local neighbourhood Land Protection committees are being expanded by 300% in number. These groups consist of knowledgeable people local to each specific area who are privy to land protection opportunities within their communities.

#### **KEY ACTIVITIES — STEWARDSHIP**



The steward program is responsible for taking care of the land held by the GBLT. We feel very keenly the importance of this task and are pleased to report that all properties remain in pristine condition.

# We protect very **important land**recognized as **ecologically** *significant.*

Stewarding activities are carried out with the help of of the GBLT board, the Stewardship Committee, GBLT staff, the summer students and, most importantly, the volunteer stewards now numbering 104 people from all parts of the Bay.

This year there appears to have been little change in the number of visits to GBLT properties. Visitors remain respectful and compliant with the GBLT land use rules.

2014 was a busy year for stewardship. The stewards completed many inspection visits to all properties. Brooks Greer, the GBLT staff member responsible for stewarding, arranged two important continuing education speakers for the stewards' meetings. Kristyn Ferguson of the NCC spoke on invasive plants and Arunas Liskauskas of the MNR spoke on changes in fish populations over the years. Several stewards volunteered to staff the GBLT desk at the Boat Show. It was ensured that there were stewardship visits to all properties.

2014 summer students Thomas Tawaststjerna and Lindsay Potts did an excellent job stewarding the three most visited southern Georgian Bay properties. They also rolled out a full scale version of Conservation Quest, a kids' educational program, at Camps Queen Elizabeth and Kitchikewana and on the Lizard Island. The program ran at Pointe au Baril on two occasions, presented by the Ojibway Recreation Program. Summer student Tom also conducted U of T students to Twelve Mile Bay to carry out sediment testing. Lindsay Potts joined a GBF team to remove a stand of *Phragmites australis* in Honey Harbour. They also monitored mooring sites, removed invasive sedums and helped with special events.

There is a new GBLT website which will permit stewardship reporting while on-property, using a smartphone. The reports include visitor numbers and activities, at risk and invasive species sightings and other information which should allow more detailed monitoring and data collection to assess long term trends.

This year we have a new Land Use Policy developed by Bill Lougheed. It has assigned each of the properties to one of three use-based groups. These are described in detail on the website.

We are very grateful to the many generous people who offer their support to the Stewardship Program.

Our continued progression as an organization depends on our ability to engage both individuals and communities in our mission. Promoting awareness of the unique ecological, geological and historical importance of the eastern coast of Georgian Bay is the goal of the GBLT Communications team.

This past year was a busy one with a variety of special events that helped us achieve success in this respect. Our events provided opportunities for people to come together and share experiences and be part of the GBLT's work. Highlights of 2014 included Winterlude, our extremely well attended rock walks on the Pancakes and Painted Rocks led by geologist and GBLT Director Nick Eyles, a lighthouse history presentation and cocktails on Brébeuf, the 'Day on the Bay' photo project on the August long weekend and a screening of Ed Burtynsky's *Watermark* film at Honey Harbour church. There were also three fundraising events this year that really helped to promote our cause in the wider community: Martyrs' Shrine Commodore's Dinner – the "Blessing of the Boats", the Scotiabank Waterfront 5K Walk and our Annual Art Auction. These and several others hosted by generous community members saw more than 600 people attending GBLT events in 2014.

In 2014 the communications team began working hard to refine our communication tools so that they reflect our message of land protection more clearly. The team would like us ultimately to stand out beside our fellow Georgian Bay organizations as protectors of land and wilderness. You may notice on your drive home from up north this spring the new GBLT billboard, a great call to action for fellow Georgian Bay lovers. Last year we also launched an entirely new website for the GBLT; it's been updated and streamlined so as to be more user friendly and easier to manage behind the scenes. As always, we could never be as effective in our communications without our volunteers. Together we strive to continue to educate our diverse community members about the delicate nature of the area, and also encourage their active involvement in its protection.

West Wind continues to prevail at the GBLT!

Positive momentum continued to build during 2014. Trust in a solid and growing donor base coupled with lots of enthusiasm from our teams of volunteers and advisors pushed annual giving up by 15% in 2014. Equally important, the donor base of Canadians increased by 12% and Americans by 21%. While annual results are how most organizations rate their success, direction and building a solid longer term foundation for fundraising is most important to meeting the goals of the GBLT.

# The GBLT is *pleased* to report a **very positive year** in our funds held for **investment** purposes.

The fund grew from an opening balance of \$1,490,028 by \$126,960 representing a year over year investment return of 8.5% leading to a gross year end balance of \$1,554,519 after distributions of \$62,474.

The GBLT's ongoing target and Canadian Revenue Agency (CRA) obligations leads us to distribute 4% of our funds to general purposes. The intention is to meet goals and to achieve long term stable asset growth matching the profile and needs of the GBLT mandate.

The fund is invested in a broad grouping of conservative and established Canadian equities plus 20% of preferred shares and 20% US stocks.




