

# **Corridor Project Ecologist Job Description**

Title: Corridor Project Ecologist

**Reports To:** Protected Areas Manager

**Location:** Southern Georgian Bay and remote

(South of 12 Mile Bay and north of Honey Harbour)

**Duration:** Full-time contract

#### Overview:

The Georgian Bay Land Trust (GBLT) Corridor Project Ecologist is a full-time position that will be responsible for the monitoring and management of lands acquired under a new project focusing on creating corridors in the Muskoka region of Georgian Bay. These corridors consist of a network of protected areas that encompass a large number of different ecosystem types and species at risk. This position reports to the Protected Areas Manager, but will focus on the stewardship of this matrix of corridors to ensure that they are monitored and managed effectively. The majority of the summer work will require being based in southern Georgian Bay and the winter work will be done in the GBLT's Toronto office or remotely. Responsibilities will include:

- Annual monitoring of the target lands using both on foot, drone, or aerial imagery
- Ground-truthing of previously mapped disturbances
- Managing summer staff to ensure monitoring targets are achieved
- ELC classification of subject lands with emphasis on high detail ecosystem types
- Liaising with landowners, donors, and other stakeholders
- Assisting with other GBLT research and programs as necessary
- Managing, tracking, and reporting species and species at risk data

This position will require knowledge of the Georgian Bay environment and will include training regarding the inventory work and survey protocols. It will require technical expertise, attention to detail, and the ability to work in small teams in remote locations.

# **Key Responsibilities:**

### 1. Corridor Monitoring

- Conduct annual monitoring of corridors using aerial imagery
- Conduct annual ground inspections and ELC ground-truthing
- Complete rotating ground inspections of all corridors
- Coordinate all monitoring and management activities
- Identify disturbances, verify disturbances in the field, and identify high-priority sites for human disturbances

### 2. Corridor Management

- Review, implement, and update existing corridor stewardship plan
- Coordinate volunteer stewards and summer staff to ensure adequate monitoring of all corridors throughout the year
- Enforce restrictions on subject lands if disturbances are noted
- Report and track monitoring and stewardship work

#### 2. Other Conservation activities

- Assist with field monitoring of GBLT properties when time permits, including data collection, breeding bird surveys, reptile monitoring, etc.
- Provide support for research projects when time permits, including breeding bird surveys, coastal wetland monitoring, etc.
- Attend training with other GBLT staff on species identification, ecosystem classification, and other related activities
- Assist in grant applications for work to be undertaken on corridors

## **Skills & Aptitudes:**

- Interest in the conservation of eastern Georgian Bay
- Familiar with environmental science and natural heritage
- Interest in and comfort around wildlife
- Experience, interest and/or abilities in field inventories, vegetation community classification, and field identification of birds and vascular plants
- Interest in outdoor recreation and familiarity with reading maps and working with GPS
- Familiarity with the ecosystem of Georgian Bay, as well as species assemblages
- Understand and be familiar with ArcGIS Pro
- Able to manage small teams of staff
- Able to work well in small groups to accomplish specific goals and tasks quickly and efficiently
- Must be prepared to work flexible hours, including some weekends
- Must be comfortable with daily boat travel, both canoe and motorboat, in a variety of weather
- A boater's license and boating experience in Georgian Bay is beneficial
- Must be available to be in southern Georgian Bay from May to October, with own accommodations in the area or willingness to stay at a field station.
- Be familiar with and share the mission and objectives of the Georgian Bay Land Trust
